Guest Speaker – **Jeanne Riley "Confessions of a Serial Quilter"**

In the early 70's Jeanne inadvertently discovered quilting and immediately ditched all her interest in other crafts such as sewing, macramé, decoupage, and has been quilting continuously since then. In the 80's she had a dream job working part-time in a quilt shop and teaching classes and has continued to teach quilting to anyone who shows the least bit of inclination toward it.
