2025 Pennsylvania Farm Show Block Opportunity

The farm show block requirements leave lots of room for your imagination. The theme is Fall Harvest. Blocks should be constructed of 100% pre-washed cotton fabric in the fall color palette, and should measure 12.5" x 12.5" unfinished, with no buttons, charms, or paint. One pieced block and one appliqué block may be submitted. The web site (farmshow.pa.gov) will have directions on how to register. Registrations open later in the year (about September). Entrants must pre-register online by Dec. 15, 2024 (sooner is better). In December, a tag will be sent which must be attached to the block. The block can be mailed to Harrisburg. For reference only, this link has the 2024 guidelines.
