ADMISSION

TEA BLOCK 2023

We ask each person who attends to make a quilt block - the instructions are enclosed. Bring it on the day of the Tea and turn it in at the designated table. The collected blocks will be raffled in the main dining room at the end of the day. **Please take extra care to sew accurately with 1/4" seams and check that your completed block has the listed measurements.**

QUILT EXHIBIT

We will have a display of recent projects made by the Loose Threads members. Enjoy the exhibit and then vote for your favorite quilt to receive the Viewer's Choice Award using the ballot included in your packet.

CRAFT SALE

There will be a variety of new handcrafted items and kits for sale that have been made by our members.

LTQ BASKET AUCTION

2023 TEA DISCUSSION GROUPS

Cute, Easy, Fun Christmas Ornaments - Let's plan ahead! Come with ideas for cute, easy, fun Christmas ornaments and make one too.

Measure Up with Specialty Rulers - Brush up on how to use those specialty rulers you bought and forgot how to use. Rulers from Deb Tucker, Fons and Porter, Bonnie Hunter, and Eleanor Burns will be demonstrated. Also, get a refresher on how to use the bloc-loc and binding tool to finish up those quilts.

Marking Tools for Quilts and Labels - Discussion and demonstration of favorite tips, tricks, and tools for marking your quilts to either disappear (magically!) or stay put forever. Feel free to share your own marking tool hits or misses!

From Scrap Mountain to Quick Quilts - Using one rectangle we'll show you how to make an easy pattern that you can use for any size project. Variations of color and block size will be demonstrated to show endless possibilities for using this simple pattern to reduce your mountain of scraps.

Fractured Quilts – Have you ever seen the group quilts made from a picture that was divided up into sections that a few people work on? These quilts are a wonderful opportunity to test your creative spirit in a small format. Come join us to see what 7 Loose Threads members did and what other possibilities could be had using this technique!

Travel, Cruises, Retreats - Do you like to quilt? Do you like to travel? Come share how to combine quilts and travel in multitudes of ways.

Sashiko, Kantha and Big Stitch Quilting - What is sashiko, kantha and big stitch quilting? What is it used for and how do you do it? We will discuss these three techniques, the differences, and similarities, where they come from and how to use them in our next project. We'll also discover the meditative value of hand stitching.

2023 TEA BLOCK

Sweet Caroline

12 1/2" by 12 1/2" unfinished

Requirements:

Red quilting cotton (solid, print, batik, scrappy)
White quilting cotton (solid or white on white)
1/4" seam allowances



Cutting:

White

2 - 5 1/2" squares
8 - 5" x 1 1/2" rectangles
4 - 1 1/2" squares

Red

2 - 5 1/2" squares
4 - 5" x 1 1/2" rectangles
5 - 1 1/2" squares



1. Draw a diagonal line on the back of the 5 1/2" white squares. Layer them right sides together with the red 5 1/2" squares. Sew 1/4" on each side of the drawn diagonal line. Cut along the drawn line and press units open to make 4 units. Trim these half square triangle units to 5" by 5".



2. Following the picture, sew the red and white rectangles together to make 4 units. Trim unit to 3 1/2" x 5".



3. Following the picture, assemble the center 9 patch unit using the 1 1/2" squares. Unit measures 3 1/2" x 3 1/2".

4. Layout the units according to the block picture above and sew together. Your block should measure 12 1/2" by 12 1/2".
