#### July Block of the Month

These directions should look very familiar to you. This was the block that Linda Glass chose for her April BOM. Well, **Stephanie Adrian** liked it so much that it is her choice for July. This time you'll be using different fabrics - use black as one color and any other bright color as the second fabric.



#### "Twin Sisters" or "Jack and Jill Block" ala Missouri Star Quilt Co.

Sew an 18"x 2½" BLACK strip to an 18" x 2½" strip of a BRIGHT COLOR.

Cut the sewn strips into  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " increments.

Cut each square from corner to corner once on the diagonal.

Note: All must be cut in the same direction.

Select 4 triangles and sew them together as shown. Notice the BLACK pieces form an x.

# Getting to Know You

### Cathy Nelson

At Loose Threads meetings, when you hear "Hi Mom" it's usually Laurie Kelly greeting her mother, Cathy Nelson, whom she introduced to quilting a few years ago. It's often the other way around, with "Mom" leading her daughter to a new interest and skill so we'll have to hear more about that.

Cathy grew up in West Philadelphia, the oldest of 4 sisters and 1 brother. After West Catholic High School she attended Misericordia Hospital Nursing School where she earned her RN, then got married and went right to work at Sacred Heart Hospital in Norristown. She took a 5-year hiatus from work to welcome Laurie, Mark and Kelly, then they moved on to Paoli and she continued her work at Norristown, traveling to and from work on the Hi-Speed line.

Meanwhile, Cathy was moving on with Nursing and after a move to West Chester in 1974 she cared for retirees at the Camilla Hall (Immaculata) facility, then on to Bryn Mawr Rehab Hospital where she spent 6 more years. Eventually she left hands-on nursing and joined Prudential Insurance Company which was then sold to Aetna in 1985 and where she became Manager of Catastrophic Case Management requiring her to travel around every county East of the Mississippi! She was most happy to retire a few years ago and at last had more time on her hands.

Cathy had learned to sew in high school and her mother made a lot of clothes for her. When Laurie finished school and went to work at "Dress and Drape", Cathy's interests perked up, then Laurie got the quilting bug and joined Loose Threads 22 years ago, enjoying our babysitting features with her 3 children. Laurie had introduced Cathy to our Teas which she attended with a neighbor for about 5 years but Cathy considered everyone very skilled and far beyond her abilities. She also cared for elders for a few years after retirement but then in 2012, Cathy joined Loose Threads. She was thrilled with the group and initially took baby steps into quilting, making small quilted articles and eventually taking on more and more complex projects. Her favorites are contemporary quilts.



Cathy also took on responsibilities within our Guild, especially serving as a representative for our adventuresome field trips, arranging busses, tickets, routes, etc. We have enjoyed many a trip thoughtfully planned by Cathy.

In addition to quilting, Cathy does enjoy life at the shore for a few family weeks each summer and longer stays in sunny Florida each winter and she enjoys a serious interest in gardening when time permits.

She has very much enjoyed her years with Loose Threads, attending some of the retreats, and participating in workshops to learn new skills. Thanks, Laurie, for bringing "Mom" to our Guild -- we have all greatly mutually benefitted!
