

September Workshop

This is the information for the TUESDAY workshop with Gyleen Fitzgerald:

Going in Circles - Full Day Workshop

Description: Very similar to the Drunkard's Path with an extra curve. Learn raw edge applique technique to achieve perfect "stress-free" curves without piecing. Experiment with different layout designs to produce a unique design. This project stitches very fast; most finish complete top during the workshop. Wall hanging (25" x 25") uses 16 fabrics from 4 color groups.

Fabric Requirements:

(16) 6" x 22" strips (assorted variety of fabric).
Door Peephole – from hardware store, get the cheapest 36" square cotton batting for design wall
1 yard for backing and binding
30" x 30" batting

Homework:

Cut (2) 6" x 6" squares from each (16) fabrics. Cut (1) 3" x 6" rectangle from each (16) fabrics. Bring all remaining fabric to class.

Special tools: None

Instructions: Pattern (\$10)

General supplies:

Sewing machine with manual; ¼" foot without edge guide (if possible); neutral thread; seam ripper; thread snips; rotary cutter, ruler and mat; paper scissors; 8" fabric scissors; and straight pins.

Gyleen's thoughts: Select fabric based on scale and texture rather than color and try not to over match. When in doubt, bring extra 6" strips. Going for a touch of modern? Use solids or semi-solids.

Recipe of the Month

Along with the quilts of Jack Edson, the other item that got rave reviews at the August 16th meeting was those tasty snacks that Eileen Frankil brought for us to sample. By popular demand, here is the recipe.

Sticky Ham and Cheese Buns

There are many versions of this recipe on Pinterest. Here is the way Eileen Frankil made it.*

Three dozen small Kings Hawaiian buns 36 thin slices of ham- about ¾ pound 36 thin slices of Swiss cheese – about ¾ pound ½ cup Mayonnaise

Sauce:

½ cup (1 stick) butter

1 Tablespoon mustard

1 Tablespoon Worcestershire sauce

2 Tablespoons Brown Sugar

1 Tablespoon poppy seeds



In small saucepan, bring all sauce ingredients to a boil. Lower the heat and let simmer for a few minutes. Set aside.

Slice buns in half. Put a bit of mayonnaise on top and bottom of each bun. Add a slice of ham and a slice of cheese to each and assemble sandwiches. Place tightly packed into a couple of baking dishes. Pour sauce all over, using a spatula to make sure they are all coated. Cover with foil and let marinate in fridge for at least one hour, or overnight.

Bake in preheated 350 degree oven for 10 minutes covered, and an additional 10 minutes uncovered.

NOTE: Other recipe versions use 12 or 24 buns with same amount of sauce. Eileen used 36 buns. Using fewer buns would be much stickier and sweeter.
