

#### Beatles Challenge



We're half way there...it's six months until our Holiday Brunch and the reveal of this year's challenge, the Beatles. A quick survey at the June meeting showed that many have started, several can't decide due to an abundance of ideas and Betty Ann is already done!

#### To recap the rules:

Use any Beatles' song or lyric as an inspiration for your challenge quilt. You can utilize any technique, fabric, embellishment or shape to make your quilt. It should measure no larger than 160 inches around the perimeter.

(And songs from their solo recording days are also acceptable.)

#### **Fabric Exchange**

July's **Batik** color is **gold**. Cut 6 ½" squares and place them in a zip lock bag marked with your group, A or B, and your name.

- <u>Group A</u> turns their squares into Clem Dupont at each business meeting.
- **Group B** turns their squares into Marylou Boryta.
- If either Clem or Marylou is NOT at a meeting, give your squares to Linda Glass



**Announcements:** A memorial service for former member, Jean Atwood, has been planned by her family and will be held on June 14 at 11:00am at the Faith of Phoenixville Baptist church.

A card from Geri Dulis was read, thanking everyone for their calls and cards during her recent convalescence.

**The Challenge:** All were reminded to keep working on their Challenge project for December.

<u>Charity Projects</u>: Nancy Kinyon-Samec reported on the total number of completed charity quilts made by Loose Threads members and available for distribution. Additional fabrics are available for charity projects, see Nancy for additional information. Our host church has also been the recipient of fabrics that they are passing along to Loose Threads for charity projects.

<u>Day Camp</u>: Sign up with Betty Ann Dawson if you wish to attend the next Day Camp on October 9-10. The cost is \$20 and monies are being collected by Betty Ann at this time. Available space limits the attendance to 32-35.

**Hospitality**: A volunteer was requested for temporary help with the Hospitality Team for several months beginning in August when Gayle Hammond will be recovering from knee surgery.


**Row by Row:** Boxes with projects are being exchanged today, June 6.

#### Game Shows

As we watch Eileen Frankil's second brother, Jim McGinnis, compete on Jeopardy on July 3, it brought back memories of my experience on a game show. Living in Los Angeles in the late 1960's, I had several co-workers who had been contestants on "You Don't Say" - an NBC afternoon game show hosted by Tom Kennedy (sort of a Tom Bergeron of the day). The format of the game included a "celebrity" who played with a contestant, vs. another "celebrity" with a second contestant. The focus of the game was to come up with the name of a famous person or place so the host would call out a clue such as "On Mondays, homemakers usually always do the \_ Answer: "Wash... Washington... George Washington!" (Yes, it's true... there were lots of homemakers in the '60's who still declared Mondays as Wash Day). Winners solved more clues than their opponents.

To become a contestant, one had to attend a taping show at NBC Studios in Burbank, pick up an application there, fill it out and mail to the producer in Hollywood. Applications were sorted and potential contestants were invited to the Hollywood office to play the game. It went pretty well so I was called for a second game-playing session in Hollywood. Passed that "interview" too so then received a call two weeks later to be at the NBC Studio on a Thursday evening and take 3 changes of clothes with me – "bright colors" requested, no black/white. Potential contestants had to wait until the contestant before them bowed out, and when I was next in line, I was asked what type of refreshment I would like: Scotch, bourbon, gin, vodka, etc.— all served in coffee mugs, trying to get anxious contestants relaxed.... as the producers already were!

They taped three shows one at a time and I got on the second and third game of the night with my celebrity partner, Mary Ann Mobley, a former Miss America. We did well and I came back the following week with more wardrobe, to play with celebrity Dwayne Hickman, "Dobie Gillis" of Gilligan's Island. Didn't take long that time and I was stumped but happy to have had the experience of being on three shows AND I earned \$500 which just covered the cost of two round-trip plane tickets home to the Midwest for Christmas!

# Quilters Unlimited Quilt Show

My daughter, Sharon, and I took beautiful back roads to get to Chantilly, Virginia for the quilt show put on by the Northern Virginia quilt guilds that ran from June 1-3, 2018. It is a huge quilt show rivaling the ones we go to locally. Vendors are plentiful coming from far flung places such as Louisiana, Florida, and Massachusetts. (Yes, I made several purchases!) The quilts are grouped by the guilds, Arlington, Vienna, Alexandria, etc.

The most fascinating display of quilts was one entitled Whisper Down the Lane. Remember Whisper Down the Lane? The first person makes a quilt based on a photograph. In this case, it was a vase of flowers with a small elephant in the background. She gives it to the second person who makes a quilt with her interpretation of the first quilt. (This quilter picked up on the elephant). She passes only her quilt to the next person to be interpreted by that person. The final quilt's theme was Japanese flowers! I'd love to participate in this with five quilting friends!

Sharon and I took a class, Scrap Petals, all day on Sunday with Penni Domikis

(www.cabinquilters.com). We arrived with our background prepared in quadrants. Sharon and I fused our petals while most of the class used a product called Terial Magic. Of course I bought some. When you spray it on fabric and iron it, it becomes as stiff as paper. It ran through my printer making perfect quilt labels. It washes out to become fabric like again.

It was a great weekend!
