
## Creating Fiber Lace Scarves

In the end, we decided that 'more is definitely better' as far as the variety and amount of materials to use. Can't wait until July's show-n'-tell to see the end results.



## Getting to Know You

## Diane Hess

It's time to meet one of our newer members, Diane Hess, who grew up in Lancaster County, just outside of Millersville. Her path took her to Penn Manor High School, on to Penn State University and eventually to the Pottstown area.

Diane's maternal grandmother was one of those nimble fingered individuals who could sew, knit, embroider, crochet, tat, etc., she did it all, and she began teaching Diane to sew when she was about 10 years old. She often stayed with her grandparents for 4-5 days at a time and over the years Diane learned to hand sew, make garments, knit, crochet and do cross-stitch. She still keeps busy with most all but just never got into knitting so much. Since her grandmother did not quilt, Diane is mostly a self-taught (trial and error) quilter, taking it up when she was pregnant with her daughter, 16 years ago.

Taking a few quilt classes over the years, Diane enjoys trying all quilting techniques at least once and is still working on that. She most enjoys standard geometric piecing and applique. Although she does do handwork, she prefers the speed of machine sewing and quilting.

At Penn State, Diane became a registered Architect and worked in that field for close to 25 years. A lay-off about three years ago was an opportunity to concentrate on her hobby of quilting. After a friend asked her to make a T-shirt quilt, she started to make T-shirt quilts for graduation gifts and that led to longarm quilting. She now has a small longarm business (coventryquilts@comcast.net).

Diane's daughter, Emma, age 16, is in the high school band and another band parent, Stephanie Adrian, invited her to attend a Loose Threads meeting. She joined LTQ in September '15 so is still enjoying her first year in the guild. Having led our February workshop, Diane cordially accepted the invitation to be assistant chairperson for next year's Quilter's Tea and plans to continue as an active member of the guild.



Aside of taking caring of her family, (husband and daughter Emma), Diane enjoys doing crafts and tending to her pet chickens. Church activities and volunteering with the high school band also fill her days. Travel is another interest and she loves stopping at quilt shops wherever she goes.

Since anything quilt-related is special to her, joining Loose Threads has meant a great deal to Diane. After virtually quilting alone for 15 years, she greatly enjoys socializing and quilting with such an amazing group of women as she has found at LTQ

Eileen Frankil reminded us at the luncheon of the delicious and healthy (!) cookie recipe that Takako is known for....here it is reprinted at popular demand.

#### RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Here is the requested recipe for the yummy Banana Oat Bars that Takako Pike made for the last meeting.

#### **BANANA OAT BARS**

2 cups quick oats (not instant)

2 large ripe banana, mashed

1/4 cup chopped walnuts

1/4 cup unsweetened applesauce, optional

1/2 cup shredded coconut

1 tablespoon date sugar, optional

1/2 cup raisins or chopped dates

I have added ¼ cup sunflower seeds in my version and did not add date sugar. Apple sauce help will bind the ingredients and make the bars moist.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Mix ingredients together in a large bowl. Press dough in a 9" x 9" baking pan. Bake for 30 min. Cool on wire rack. When cool, slice into squares or bars and serve.

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
