Minutes - February Meeting

The February Meeting was CANCELLED due to an Ice/Snow storm as Spring-Ford School District was CLOSED. These minutes were generated from emails from Committee Members.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Judy Peters reported that this month's expense was for the bus for the Lancaster Quilt Show. Income came from the business raffle, Tea food donations and interest.

New Business:

Retreats:

- The next Blue Lake Retreat is April 28th (10 AM) to May 2, 2014 (12 noon). Price is \$35/night and a \$100 cleaning charge (divided up amongst all attendees). Bring your own sheets, towels, blanket, and pillow. Sign up for meals will be closer to the retreat time. (Note: Linda Martin tried to increase our rate to \$40/night, but I convinced her we had already agreed on the \$35 rate back in the fall. Our fall retreat will be the \$40 rate). So far, 12 people signed up we can accommodate 16 comfortably for sewing space, but can move the ironing station to a different room if we get 20 signups. Plenty of sleeping space.

<u>Tea Committee:</u> Bernie Hughes went over some changes for our upcoming Tea.



2014 Quilters Tea

For those of you who are new to our annual fundraiser here is an overall look at how Friday March 7th and the Tea, March 8th are expected to happen.

First, Friday is set up day and we start at 9:30am. The tables and chairs for the tea will already be set up for us, but we will need to put out the service ware and get the kitchen ready for Saturday. The sewing room sale, book sale, craft sale and Chinese auction will be set up in the other large room downstairs. The discussion groups will be set up in assigned rooms. The quilt show will be in the Sanctuary this year. If you are not associated with one of these areas we will need your help in the kitchen/dining room area.

Second, on Saturday, since the doors will not open until 9:30 this year, the arrival time for most people will be 8 am. We ask that you bring your muffins/or cookies (each dozen plated separately) and place them on the table assigned for baked goods. Then we need to go to our assigned areas and get ready for our guests.




March Program

Our pre-ordered tape measure kits will be distributed and Lynn will give a detailed demonstration of the embroidery stitches and steps required to work on the project at home. There are NO supplies needed for this meeting

March's Polka Dot color is **Green**

Cut <u>ten</u> 6 ½ inch squares.

March Block of the Month: Lemoyne Star



Block size: 19 1/2" unfinished

Skill: Y-seam construction for Lemoyne Star

Yardage and Cutting: Based on 42" wide fabric

Background: 3/8 yd. Cut one 10" square into quarters diagonally for side triangles (see diagram
 A). Cut four 6 1/2" squares for corners.

• Star: ¼ yd each. Cut two 2 ½" x 42" strips from each of two fabrics

Construction: Use $\mbox{\em 1}''$ seams throughout. Refer to diagrams for additional help.


- 1. Sew 2 ½" strips together in pairs to make two strip sets. (Offset one strip by 2 ½"-see diagram B). Press the seam allowance in the direction of the darker fabric.
- 2. Using the 45 degree angle marking on the ruler, cut at $2\,\%$ " intervals along the entire length of the strip sets to make a total of 16 units.
- 3. Sew the units together in pairs to make 8 pieced diamonds. (Diagram C). (See diagram D for offset seam placement.)
- 4. Arrange all of the pieced diamonds with the background patches. (Note the background triangles are oversized.)
- 5. Use Y-seam construction to sew the pieces together into units, always pressing open the seam allowances that will meet in the center of the star. (Diagram E).
- 6. Sew the units together in pairs and finally join the pairs to complete the block.
- 7. Trim and straighten the edges of the block to measure 19 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 19 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".




















mark 1/4" seam. Put dot where lines intersect

Note: Background triangles are oversized.

Press Seam 3 open Press Seams 1 & 2 toward diamond blocks Back stitch at the dots to secure the seam. Do not stitch past the dot.




Diagram F. Final construction seams applied

Free Pattern: Scrappy Shamrock Block

Just in time for St. Patrick's Day, here's an easy-to-piece Scrappy Shamrock block. It's based on simple four patch squares with stitch-and-flip corners.

How can I use this St. Patrick's Day quilt block? For a simple wall hanging, set your Scrappy Shamrock blocks diagonally, with simple sashing:
