## Challenge 2016 - "Birds and Words"

#### LAST MINUTE REMINDERS

- Quilts are due at our December 7, 2016 holiday meeting and must be finished.
- Two elements must be on the front of the quilt. At least one bird, and at least one word. The word(s) may be in any language.
- You can use any technique.
- Maximum perimeter is 160 inches. May be smaller, but not larger.
- Clothing or other quilted items are acceptable.
- Bring your project in a plain bag and place it on the stage for hanging by the committee.
- You may submit more than one project in separate bags.
- Voting will be explained at the event.
- DON'T SHOW YOUR PROJECT TO ANY MEMBER BEFORE THE BIG REVEAL ON DEC 7.

## Block of the Month - December

#### **Brick Block**

Design submitted by Lenore Clarke

You will be working with  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " strips, so use those bits from trimming the edge of a quilt. Make half of them dark with light centers, and the other half light with dark centers.

<u>Set-up</u>:

Each brick uses two fabrics, A and B. From fabric A you will need two 9  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips and two 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares. From fabric B you will need one 5  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strip. Make sure your seams are  $\frac{1}{4}$ " wide.

<u>Step 1</u>: Sew one 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " square from fabric A *to each end* of the fabric B strip. Press seams toward fabric A.

<u>Step 2:</u> Sew one 9  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strip of fabric A to each edge of the unit prepared in step 1. Press seams toward the fabric A strip.

If you make a pair of blocks at the same time, you will need one strip of Fabric A and one strip of Fabric B that is 29 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> inches long by 2 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> inches wide.

This year's <u>fabric exchange</u> will be Striped Fabrics, cut into 6 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" Squares. It will begin in November. For those who like to shop ahead below is the schedule for the whole year. Feel free to cut your squares all at once and bring them to Clem Dupont or Linda Hamel.

green red & green dark blue pink yellow purple turquoise light/med blue gold black & white red brown

Note: The stripes do <u>NOT</u> have to be strictly vertical stripes. Have fun, submit wavy or zig-zag. The fabric colors do <u>NOT</u> have to be solely the designated color but can have other colors within the fabric. If the color is green, the fabric should just read predominately green.

Cotton Weeds Quilt shop in Freeport, Maine is located on Rt. 1, just down the road from LL Bean and other stores such as Banana Republic, Gap and Old Navy.

Cotton Weeds is your basic quilt shop, not huge, but carrying enough of different styles to please every quilter looking to add to her stash. A good variety of batiks, traditional, children's, and holiday fabrics. They also carry wool squares, needle punch and embroidery supplies and patterns, as well as patterns for lots of bags and totes. There are lots of samples of all of these. Staff is friendly, prices are average. Open daily, hours vary.

Bonus shopping - right next door is a yarn shop for those who knit, and Econo Lodge shares the parking lot (no need to drive!) And just in case your husband is bored, he can wander over to sample a brew at Maine Beer Co.!

## Recipe of the Month

What to do with all that summer squash and zucchini??? Here's a great recipe taken from the Pottstown Mercury by Melissa d'Arabian.

#### Italian Squash Bake

medium – large zucchini, sliced
medium – large yellow squash, sliced
large shallots, sliced
tomatoes, sliced
tomatoes, sliced
sp dried Italian herb seasoning (make your own, look it up online)
Tbsp olive oil
Juice of ½ lemon
cup shredded mozzarella or parmesan cheese, or mixed
Salt and pepper

Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Spray baking dish with non-stick cooking spray. Season the vegetables with salt and pepper. Layer the vegetables 'shingle style' in the baking dish; the slices should not lie flat. Sprinkle on the garlic cloves (I sliced the cloves) and the dried herbs. Drizzle on the olive oil and squeeze on the lemon juice.

Cover with foil and bake for 30 minutes. Remove the foil and continue baking for an additional 30 minutes, sprinkling on the cheese for the last 15 minutes. Serve warm or at room temperature. Serves 4.

She now prefers hand sewing, especially applique, and enjoys using her hands rather than the sewing machine. Marie belonged to the Valley Forge Guild, then heard that there was a day-time guild not too far away so she joined Loose Threads about 13 years ago. Since then she has served as Secretary, committee head for the Christmas brunch for 3-4 years, worked on the Chinese auction and led several tea discussion groups. Marie also served as the LTG librarian for a year and was instrumental in moving our books into a bookcase after shuffling them back and forth in milk cartons. Her husband then handily installed wheels and a platform on the bookcase to make it more mobile. She also started our system of card "pockets" to help with our library loaning system.
