Minutes - August Meeting

The Monthly Business Meeting of the Loose Threads Quilt Guild was held at the United Church of Christ in Spring City, PA on August 2, 2023 and facilitated by President, Betty Ann Dawson. The meeting was called to order at 10:08am.

Old Business: July Minutes were approved.

- Fabric Sale reminder on Saturday, August 19th (with set-up on Friday, August 18th). Please sign up for a volunteer timeslot with Lillian Evans. Set-up on Friday begins at 9am with the lifting of heavy tables. There will be no "IOU's" for the sale (bring cash or check). Please donate bags, paper bags are strongly preferred. Any leftover plastic bags will be collected and donated for recycling by Laurie Kelly.
- The dilemma of the quilt rack storage has been solved as Betty Ann is moving. Diane Hess will temporarily store the racks until their rental by Main Line Quilters in November. Mellissa will store the racks after their return.

We've spent all that time cutting, piecing and assembling our quilt top, now we need to find someone to finishing it with the perfect quilting design. Here is a short list of Loose Threads members and local shops that may fit the bill.

We also offer custom, free-motion quilting for projects with appliqué or any elements that preclude E2E computerized quilting. Please call for an appointment if you want custom free motion.

To get a price quote based on the information below, **call us** (484-920-8971) during business hours or email us anytime at info@SeamlessSewingArts.com.

- Width and length of your quilt top
- Type of backing you will provide or purchase at Seamless: pieced or 108" fabric
- Choice of batting from Seamless: Pellon 80/20, Quilters Dream 80/20, Hobbs 80/20 or bring your own at least 2" larger on each side than your top
- Whether you want your project squared, bound or both
- Whether you want E2E or custom free motion quilting.

When you call, we will calculate the price on the spot and answer any questions not covered here. There is a \$50 minimum for quilting services.

The Old Country Store offers long-arm, edge-to-edge quilting services. Currently we are **completing quilts in 3-4 weeks** of receipt. If you have a deadline, let us know and we'll see what we can do to accommodate you.

You've contacted someone about quilting your pieced top. Now what???

- Talk about pricing. Determine what is included batting, thread, shipping, tax and what isn't.
- Discuss a deadline.
 - Ask about which one of you will trim layers and attach binding.
 - Provide/identify inspiration images or quilting motifs you like.
 - Share thread color ideas and batting preferences.
 - Confirm delivery method.
- Prep quilt for quilting

Assure backing fabric is 4" larger on all sides

Press backing seams open

Iron top and backing

Mark orientation of quilt top and backing

Remove any embellishments
