July Block of the Month

This Pattern was created by Jean Roat for Quilt for Kids Inc. a few years ago, I couldn't find it on their web site and my copy was too light to recopy. Her quilt name was Batik Bonanza even though it looks good with complimentary colors or scraps.

- 1. Using 2 inch strips, sew 7 strips together to make the strip set.
- 2. Measure the distance from top to bottom (figure A), this will be your square size. (If you use 2" strips this will be about an 11 inch square adjust as needed). You will need 2 of these squares for each block.
- 3. With strip set sitting horizontally as in fig. B cut diagonally from the lower right hand corner to the upper left had corner. Consistency is the key here. It is important to cut all the blocks in the same direction.
- 4. You will have 2 triangles from each block and you need 4 for each new block arrange as shown in figure C

For the quilt: Eight (8) 11" squares will give you 4 completed squares. Use a 3" solid color for the shashing in between the blocks. . Sew the remaining scrap strips together and cut them 4-5" wide for the border.





