#### RECIPE OF THE MONTH

#### **CHEWY IRISH COFFEE BLONDIES**

**Blondies:** 3 Tbsp. freshly ground coffee

2 sticks unsalted butter salt

2 c. all-purpose flour 2 large eggs

1 tsp. baking powder 1 tsp. pure vanilla extract 1/2 tsp. baking soda 1/2 c. sliced almonds, skin on

2 c. packed light-brown sugar

Glaze:

1 Tbsp. melted butter, warm

2 Tbsp. Irish whiskey

3/4 c. confectioners' sugar, sifted



Make the blondies: Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Butter a 9-by-13-inch baking pan, and line with parchment so that it overhangs on all sides. Butter parchment. Whisk together flour, baking powder, and baking soda.

Melt butter, and pour into a mixing bowl with brown sugar, ground coffee, and 1 teaspoon salt. Stir to combine. Stir in eggs and vanilla extract. Stir in flour mixture until just combined. Pour batter into pan, and sprinkle with almonds. Bake 27 to 30 minutes, depending on how chewy you like your blondies (a shorter baking time results in a chewier blondie). Let cool completely.


Make the glaze: Whisk together butter and whiskey. Gradually whisk in confectioners' sugar until glaze is thick but pourable (you may not need all the sugar). Using a spoon or a pastry bag fitted with a plain round tip, drizzle glaze over blondies in a rough crosshatch pattern. Let glaze dry 1 hour. Cut blondies into 2-inch squares.

#### **BLOCK OF THE MONTH**

#### "Pretty Flower for Mystery BOM

Cut a 4" square of background fabric. Flower pattern is sized for fusible. If you want to turn needle applique, add seam allowance. Using preferred method, applique flower and leaves on background fabric.





#### **QUILT JUMBLE ANSWER**



**Log Cabin:** A quilt pattern in which narrow fabric strips, or logs, surround a center square to form a block. These may be pieced from strips or sewn onto a

foundation of paper or fabric. The blocks have many variations including the pineapple block.

### APRIL: BLOCK 8 (6" finished)

# CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS Dark: cut two 3½" squares Medium: cut one 2½" square Light: cut two 3½" squares & four 2½" squares

- 1. Sew four QSTs using the two dark and light  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares. Trim to  $2\frac{1}{2}$ ."
- 2. Piece block, using the illustration for placement.

To keep your ironing surface clean, press freezer paper to the top of your ironing surface (shiny side down) when you are (1) fusing fabrics or (2) paper piecing with papers that were created on a printer/copier. The freezer paper can easily be removed when you are done.
