**Block-of-the Month:** A finished 4-1/2" block was shared by Judy Snook.

Charity Quilts: Jean Sullivan thanked members for their help with charity quilts. Jill Cardamone stated that the committee has designated June as *Pillowcase Month* with finished projects going to ConKerr Cancer. Members are asked to prewash fabrics, use one of the patterns available on the Loose Threads website, and turn in completed pillowcases during June and up

to July 11 (our July business meeting). Pillowcases use ¾ yd. fabric plus 1/3 yd. for a border and are to be submitted in sealed plastic baggies.

1/4 cup chopped walnuts


½ cup shredded coconut


### NEW BOOKS ON THE MARKET\_

## **Shadow Trapunto Quilts**By Greta Grama

There is little as elegant and attractive as shadow trapunto. Few people realize just how easy it is to make these stunning quilts.



### **QUILT CHALLENGE**

Your challenge is to make not one, but two complementary quilts. Technique, color, fabric are all up to you. The two quilts should in some way complement each other, in color, design, technique, whatever your imagination envisions. Both quilts could be an appropriate size for a Priority Alzheimer's quilt (9" x 12" maximum, no exceptions). Both quilts do not have to be the same size.

**Rule** (there is only one): Quilters must submit 2 quilts that are no larger than 12" x 18" each. We will measure and we will have no mercy. Please pin your two quilts to a single piece of muslin for display (your name on the back of the muslin).

Awards (each pair of quilts will be eligible for only one prize):

- First Finished (show it to a committee member)
- Participation (randomly drawn from all entries) Quilts can win only one of the following awards:
- · Best embellishment
- Best interpretation of the theme
- Viewer's Choice (we will award the top three, in no particular order)
- Judge's Choice (each committee member will choose a favorite and award her own prize to that quilter)



### MINI BLOCK

### MAY: BLOCK 9 (6" finished)



#### **CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS**

Dark: cut four 2" squares, four 21/2" x 11/2" rectangles and one 31/2" square

Medium: cut one 31/2" square and four 2½" x 1½" rectangles

2½" x 1½" rectangles

Light: cut four 2" squares and four

#### **SEWING INSTRUCTIONS**

- Sew one QST with the dark and medium 31/2" squares. Trim to 21/2."
- Sew eight HSTs with the dark and light 2" squares. Trim to 11/2."
- Assemble the block as shown in the illustration. Trim to 61/2."

### STICKY CHAIN PIECING

"Chain piecing is kind of like piecing on an assembly-line. After cutting all of your quilt patches, align them right sides together to prep them for sewing, and then take one more step before you begin. Place a medium-hot iron on top of each pair, to help them stick together. Stack the paired units within easy reach next to your sewing machine and start sewing. Feed them through the

machine one after another, but without breaking the threads after stitching each pair. When units are all sewn, cut the threads between them and go on to your next task."

### **QUILTS IN THE SNOW**

Artist Simon Beck must really love the cold weather! Along the frozen lakes of Savoie, France, he spends days plodding through the snow in raquettes (snowshoes), creating these sensational patterns of snow art. Working for 5-9 hours a day, each final piece is typically the size of three soccer fields! The geometric forms range in mathematical patterns and shapes that create stunning, sometimes 3D, designs when viewed from higher levels.

How long these magnificent geometric forms survive is completely dependent on the weather. Beck designs and redesigns the patterns as new snow falls, sometimes unable to finish a piece due to significant overnight accumulations. Interestingly enough, he said, 'The main reason for making them was because I can no longer run properly due to problems with my feet, so plodding about on level snow is the least painful way of getting exercise. Gradually, the reason has become photographing them, and I am considering buying a better camera."
